Fund description

The Invesco S&P 500® High Dividend Low Volatility ETF (Fund) is based on the S&P 500 Low Volatility High Dividend Index (Index). The Fund will invest at least 90% of its total assets in common stocks that comprise the Index. Standard & Poor's® compiles, maintains and calculates the Index, which is composed of 50 securities traded on the S&P 500 Index that historically have provided high dividend yields and low volatility. The Fund and the Index are rebalanced and reconstituted semi-annually, in January and July.

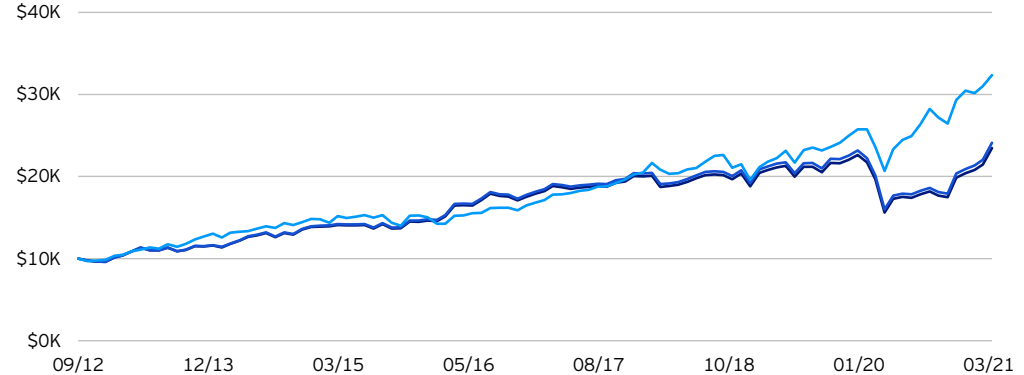

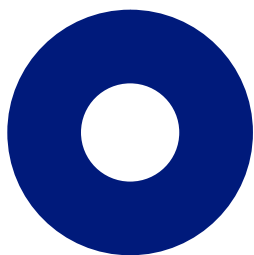

Glossary

30 Day SEC Unsubsidized Yield reflects the 30-day yield if the investment adviser were not waiving all or part of its fee or reimbursing the fund for part of its expenses. Total return would have also been lower in the absence of these temporary reimbursements or waivers.

30 Day SEC Yield is based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the period.

Intraday NAV is a symbol representing estimated fair value based on the most recent intraday price of underlying assets.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Book-Value Ratio (P/B Ratio) is the ratio of a stock's market price to a company's net asset value.

Weighted Harmonic Average Stock Price-to-Earnings Ratio (P/E Ratio) is the share price divided by earnings per share. It is measured on a 12-month trailing basis.

Weighted Average Return on Equity is net income divided by net worth.

Weighted Market Capitalization is the sum of each underlying securities market value.
